

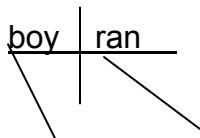
SIDEWALK CHALK DIAGRAMMING

Please rewrite your sentence on the sidewalk.

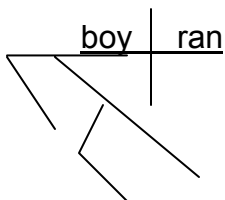
1. Circle the subject(s)

Be aware that adverbs can modify VERBS, ADJECTIVES, and OTHER ADVERBS.

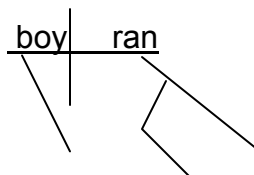
The boy ran quickly.
